







## SPYRIDOULA VARLOKOSTA

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**Spyridoula Varlokosta** is Professor of Linguistics at the Department of Linguistics, School of Philology, National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA). She is also the Director of the Psycholinguistics and Neurolinguistics Lab at NKUA. She has graduated from the Department of Philosophy, Education and Psychology, NKUA, and has received her MA and PhD from the Department of Linguistics at the University of Maryland, USA. She has worked as a postdoctoral researcher at the University of Pennsylvania (USA), as a Lecturer at the University of Reading (UK), and as an Associate Professor at the University of the Aegean.

Her research focuses on the relation between language and mind, and on the biological foundations of language. More specifically, she is interested in early language development and in language development during the school years either in monolingual or in bilingual/multilingual environments. In addition to typical language development, she has also carried out research on language development in gifted children, in children with atypical development (developmental language disorder, Down syndrome, Williams syndrome, autism spectrum disorder), and on the interaction between language and other cognitive systems (e.g. memory, attention). Her research interests further include the study of verbal and cognitive skills in adults with acquired disorders, such as post-stroke aphasia and various forms of dementia (e.g. Alzheimer's disease). She has represented Greece in various European research networks related to language development, bilingualism and language disorders. She has published extensively in international research journals and edited volumes. She has coordinated thirteen research projects as the principal investigator and has participated in twenty-three other projects as a member or a research team coordinator.
